#### March 24 - General Meeting Program Speaker - BOB BUNYUN

am pleased to announce LNHS March 24 scheduled General Meeting invited featured speaker **Bob Bunyan** accepted our invitation to share information on the history of Moulton Ranch, now the masterplanned community of Laguna Niguel neighbor Aliso Viejo.

Bob was fortunate to be present at the unique experience of the birth of the new community and also participate in its planning, design, construction and growth. Bob will be sharing with LNHS members photos, documents and personal knowledge of this growing experience. Bob authored *Images of America: Aliso Viejo*, published in 2011 that provided a look at how the last piece of the Moulton Ranch became a new South Orange County City. In the process, he met members of the Moulton Family and works collaboratively to pursue and preserve the surviving family history documents and artifacts that were part of the Ranch history.

Bob is currently president of the Aliso Viejo Community Foundation, a charitable organization founded in 1988 to support education, culture and recreational activities in Aliso Viejo. He is chairman of the Orange County Workforce Investment Board, the County agency providing support resources for worker training and assistance, and a member of the Samueli Academy career advisory committee, a charger high school in Santa Ana founded by the Orangewood Foundation. Bob is the principal of Robert Bunyan and Associates. His career has spanned 47 years in real estate development in Orange County.



With all the interesting and valuable history that Bob will be bringing, I do hope the membership will invite guests to attend this March informative program. In addition, hear more about <u>Laguna Niguel's Images of America: Laguna Niguel</u> book proposed to be on sale this Fall, authored by our own LNHS member Ted Wells (and newest Board member). This meeting should give all who attend an exciting picture of what is in the future plans of educating and preserving the history of both Laguna Niguel and Aliso Viejo cities...
